

**Pike County Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Fund and
Pike County COVID-19 Assistance Fund**

Frequently Asked Questions

Updated July 9, 2020

Q: I see ineligible expenses on there so is it considered eligible if not on that list? If so, would things like distributions to owners, pay down of principle component of debt such as mortgage principal, capital purchases such as new vehicles, large equipment or land/real property?

A: All expenses must be necessary and related to COVID-19. This must be explained when submitting the application.

Q: Is there a start and end date for either ppe expenses or business grant expenses? Example: 3/15/20 through 7/31/20?

A: Expenses must have been incurred between March 31 and December 30, 2020.

Q: Is there a min and max grant size such as \$5k to \$100k?

A: The County will balance the needs of all applicants once it is able to thoroughly assess the needs of businesses, nonprofit organizations, and municipalities through the application process. At this time, a minimum and maximum grant size has not been determined.

Q: For prioritizing businesses that did not get ppp first how is that done on rolling basis? Would it be easier to say expenses paid by ppp or other grants/forgivable loan not eligible? Ppp is easily tracked and EIDL must be paid back at close to market rate?

A: Expenses paid for by PPP, EIDL, or other programs are not eligible. In addition, the County wishes to assist businesses that were not eligible for these programs with this funding.
